Arts education students learn to think creatively, solve problems, exercise individual responsibility, collaborate with a team, and develop confidence and self-esteem, all of which are lifelong skills that will support their professional and personal success.
- Arts attendees are more than twice as likely to volunteer for local organizations, increasing investment in our own communities and enlivening social connections.
- The arts are good for our health: studies show that regular theatre
  attendance lowers the risk of dementia by 32%, reduces depression
  and anxiety by 24%, and arts participants live an average of 2.5
  years longer than other adults.

#### Land Acknowledgment

Children's Theatre Company (CTC) acknowledges that the theatre was established on land that the Wahpekute Tribe of the Dakota nation still calls home. Around the year 1600, the Wahpekute were a wandering people who landed in Mni Sota Makoce (Land Where the Waters Reflect the Clouds—and the people's roots here remain strong). They are a part of the Dakota Seven Councils of Fire, which include the Mdewakanton (Dwellers by the Sacred Lake), Sisitonwan (People of the Marsh), Wahpetonwan (Dwellers Among the Leaves), Ihanktown (People of the End), Ihanktowana (People of the Little End), Tetonwan (People on the Plains), and Wahpekute (Shooters Among the Leaves).

Today, Minnesota is a vibrant and diverse state with the history and influence of the Dakota people woven throughout. We honor and respect the many Indigenous People still connected to this land. We acknowledge that we have benefitted from systems that have hoarded power and marginalized Indigenous Nations, communities of color, the LGBTQIAP+ community, people with disabilities, women, children, and all who meet at the intersections.

CTC acknowledges that we are now stewards of the land the Wahpekute People of the Dakota Nation were largely driven from. As storytellers, it is our duty to recognize that the narratives of this region have long been told from one dominant perspective without acknowledging those whose narratives began before. It is our responsibility to the Dakota Nation, our staff, our board, our audiences, and our artists to collectively honor their lives, amplify their voices, and reimagine our future.

# Children's Theatre Company's Anti-Bias and Anti-Racism Statement





# Behind the Design

Scenic designer **Scott Davis** was inspired by Nordic traditions when conceptualizing the scenic design for Disney's *Frozen*. He leaned heavily into traditional and historic Scandinavian and Nordic folk art and designs, such as rosemaling and other patterns, to make the spaces feel alive. Snow and ice are weaved into the scenic landscape throughout the show, creating special surprises and a constant connection to the elements and the natural world.

Costume designer **Ari Fulton** drew inspiration from traditional Nordic dress. For each character, she created specific color palettes that correspond to their journeys. Look for fun touches in all of the costumes, such as the shards of glass incorporated into Elsa's dress and the forest and the sea elements in the designs for the Hidden Folk.

# CTC: What was the most rewarding aspect of adapting *Frozen* for the stage?

Kristen and Robert: The joy of creating live theatre is that every show creates a special community of people that comes together for an intense period of time. Though the community is only temporary, the connections made during the show stay with you for a lifetime.

#### Which character in Frozen do you most identify with, and why?

Kristen: I'm definitely an Anna with a hidden Elsa inside. Robert: I'm definitely an Elsa with a hidden Anna inside.

# Do you have a favorite song written specifically for the Broadway musical?

Kristen: I have to say the answer to this changes with every production. I recently saw a production in Florida and the moment young Anna sings "let the sun shine on" during the opening number brought tears to my eyes. We were channeling our youngest child when we wrote that in 2017.

Robert: For me it's "I Can't Lose You." We wrote it after the show had officially opened on Broadway, which is unusual. But we couldn't stop writing for these characters. It was the only true, full duet we've written for Anna and Elsa where they're singing the same thing in harmony and in retrospect we realized the show needed it. Now it always surprises me how much ferocity of the sisters' love comes through that music. We hoped it would be like our version of a Puccini duet.

# What was it like the first time you watched an audience experience *Frozen* live on stage?

Kristen and Robert: Honestly? Terrifying. Seven years later I can recognize that there was a tremendous amount of pressure on us to get this right.

# Why are you excited for Minnesota audiences to see the stage version of *Frozen*?

Kristen and Robert: Every production brings its own magical ingredients. Each production is a dialogue between the specific cast the producers bring together and the values and challenges every audience brings to the experience. I imagine Minnesotans know something about extreme cold and will bring their own understanding of those stakes to the story. When I was texting with Jill [Anderson, CTC's managing director] about the priorities I look for when casting Anna, I said something about how she has to be able to tell a good joke, can't be afraid to eat a cheeseburger, and has a giant heart she wears on her sleeve. Jill wrote back, "Oh, so she's a Big10 gal!" (Apparently attributes for a certain swath of upper Midwesterners?) It's these kind of specific references that will deepen the local experience.



#### Artistic Director

Rick Dildine is a director and producer. Previously, Dildine was artistic director of the Alabama Shakespeare Festival, one of the largest Shakespeare festivals in the country, artistic director of the St. Louis Shakespeare Festival, president of Shakespeare & Company, and managing director of About Face Theatre. Rick is a graduate of Brown University and member of the Stage Directors and Choreographers Society.

#### Managing Director

Jill A. Anderson oversees CTC's administrative operations, including finance, fundraising, marketing, and education. Previously, she was managing director at Syracuse Stage (NY), general manager of the Eugene O'Neill Theater Center (CT), and spent years at Arena Stage (DC), and stage managing nationally. Originally from Marshfield, WI, Anderson is delighted to return to CTC.

#### Meet the Creative Team

#### Book

Jennifer Lee is the Academy Awardwinning writer and director of Walt Disney Animation Studio's *Frozen*. For her work on Frozen, Lee received numerous awards including a Golden Globe, a Critics' Choice Award, a BAFTA Award, and an Academy Award. She wrote the book for the Broadway stage adaptation of Frozen, receiving a Tony Award nomination for Best Book of a Musical, and wrote and directed the animated feature Frozen 2. Her Disnev Animation career began as co-writer of the Oscar-nominated Wreck-It Ralph. She went on to co-write the story for the Academy Award-winning Zootopia, and served as Chief Creative Officer of Walt Disney Animation Studios from 2018 to 2024. when she began working on Frozen 3 and Frozen 4. She has executive produced numerous award-winning animated films including Moana 2, Raya and the Last Dragon, and the Academy Award-winning Encanto. Her graphic novel, As I Dream of You, will be published in 2026.

# Staff Spotlight: Amy Reddy Soft Props Artisan/Props Artisan

#### CTC: What does your job involve?

AR: My job is to help build puppets, paper props, fake food, "soft goods" (anything that has to be sewn or built with fabrics/textiles), upholstery, patterning, etc. I get to work with designers, directors, and the creative teams to create what their visions are for each production.

#### CTC: What is your favorite thing about your job?

AR: There are so many things that are my favorite that it is hard to narrow down but...I love that I get to CRAFT every day. I am a storyteller. I create things that thousands of kids to get to see. These creations inspire kids to use their imaginations, and they inspire families to want to see more and to think creatively.

#### CTC: What do you love most about CTC?

AR: This is my 25<sup>th</sup> season at CTC! I have had the privilege to work in many aspects here and have learned from so many of its people. So, I have to say, the people. My coworkers (which is everyone that works in this building), the students, our leaders, and volunteers. All of them. It's truly what makes this place special.

#### CTC: How can someone prepare for a career like yours?

AR: First, if you love theatre, just do it. The more theatre you make the more you learn. I do not think a four-year degree is necessary to have a career in professional theatre; however, I went to college and have a B.A. in Theatre Arts. I also spent a summer as a props crafts apprentice at The Santa Fe Opera which was also helpful. 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
